## Guide for Survivors of State Executive Branch Employees

As an employee of the State, you are part of our family. So we want to be sure that your loved ones know what to do and who they should contact should something unfortunate happen to you. It would be helpful if your survivors obtain copies of the death certificate from the Department of Health, Vital Records Section, to show to the various agencies. This would make things easier and faster. Please take the time to review this information with your family and keep this information with all of your important family papers. Taking a few minutes now to discuss this information with your family will make an already difficult time less burdensome. We hope you find this Guide helpful.
