

State Executive Branch Employees- GUIDE for Survivors of State Executive Branch Employees

This GUIDE is intended as a checklist of offices your loved ones need to contact and some important forms they may need to file in the event of your death. It would be helpful if your survivors obtain multiple copies of the death certificate from the Department of Health, Vital Records Section, to provide to the various agencies. Take the time to review this information with your family and keep this information with your important family papers. This GUIDE does not constitute a binding legal document or contract. It lists only some of the benefits that may be available. State benefits vary by type of employment appointment and collective bargaining agreement and are subject to change. It does not supersede laws, rules, collective bargaining agreements, executive orders, policies and procedures, or benefit plan documents pertaining to the benefits covered, and is subject to change. For more information, contact your departmental Human Resources Office (HRO) designee or refer to the applicable rules, laws, collective bargaining agreements, executive orders, or benefit plan documents.

State of Hawai'i Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) Unpaid Compensation	 SA Form D-90 Employee's Designation of Beneficiary This form allows the beneficiary(ies) of an employee to be paid all accumulated vacation pay and all earned and unpaid wages due at the time of the employee's death. If a beneficiary statement is not completed, then payment of any unpaid wages and leave is made to the employee's estate. This beneficiary designation is for payroll purposes only. Review current designation(s) and, if you need to make changes, submit revisions to your HRO designee or log into the Hawai'i Information Portal (HIP) to make these changes in the employee self-service portal. Your changes become effective immediately and your most recent designation of beneficiaries in HIP is what the State of Hawai'i will use to pay your beneficiaries in the event you pass away. Entering your beneficiary information in HIP, or making changes, will supersede any paper payroll beneficiary forms that you completed previously. 	In the event of your death, your beneficiary(ies) must contact your HRO designee. State of Hawaiʻi Employees' Retirement System (ERS) Death Benefits	 Notify ERS of the death and provide the following: Name and social security number of the deceased Date of death Name, address, and phone of surviving spouse, next of kin or contact person ERS will send the designated beneficiary information regarding the death benefits and required forms to complete. The beneficiary must file the forms within three years from the date of death. Death benefit payments are generally processed within 4-6 weeks after the receipt of the death claim forms. EUTF will provide information regarding The Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA) coverage. Your survivors may be eligible to continue to receive coverage for a pre-determined amount of time. If you are Retired Military	Your beneficiary should contact the appropriate military branch office, including the National Guard, because they may be eligible for assistance. A Survivor's Assistance Officer will help them apply for the various benefits for which they may be eligible.		
If you earned enough Social Security credits	Your beneficiary should contact Social Security Administration for information on social security benefits they may be eligible for.		
If you were a member of an employee organization (union)	Your beneficiary should contact the appropriate employee organization to find out if they are covered by that organization's insurance plan.		
If you belonged to a credit union or other financial institution	Your beneficiary should contact the credit union or financial institution to find out if there may be checking, savings, and/or loan accounts in their name.
